## **FREE COVID-19 TESTING THROUGHOUT MONO COUNTY**

There are now several options for asymptomatic adults to get tested for COVID-19 in Mono County. If you are feeling ill, please do not show up to one of the testing sites; instead people who are sick should call the 211 Nurse Hotline or their primary care provider.

### **Public Health Pop-up Testing**

Visit the Public Health Pop-Up Clinic for complimentary cloth masks and hand sanitizer (while supplies last), informational flyers and FREE COVID-19 testing. Testing is on a first-come first-served basis and is generally limited to 30 tests per day. Testing is conducted by Mono County Health staff.

### **California Community-Based Covid-19 Testing:**

Project Baseline by Verily is a clinical research initiative to facilitate screening and testing for COVID-19.

Eligible residents can sign up online for drive-through testing in Mammoth Lakes and throughout Mono County at [www.projectbaseline.com/COVID19](http://www.projectbaseline.com/COVID19). Once you have registered, you can select a location, date and time for testing. Testing is at no cost for individuals regardless of insurance status. For those unable to register and make an appointment ahead of time, impromptu testing may be available for those who show up.

Currently, Project Baseline testing is offered weekly in Mammoth Lakes and Walker. Eligible persons must be 18 years or older, live in Mono County and be willing to electronically sign the COVID-19 Public Health Authorization Form and Lab Consent. ## **IF YOU ARE ILL, CALL THE NURSE HOTLINE!**

If you are feeling ill, call the nurse Hotline, which can be accessed through the **2-1-1** information system (Mon-Fri. 8am-5pm). The nurses can provide advice and refer for COVID-19 testing. Mammoth Hospital now has increased testing capacity and is recommending anyone feeling ill be tested for COVID-19.



COVID-19 symptoms typically include fever, cough, and/or shortness of breath, but could also be similar to the symptoms of a typical flu or cold. Symptoms may also be severe, including difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, or inability to arouse and bluish lips or face.

## **THE PATH FORWARD – REOPENING MONO COUNTY**

## **GUIDELINES FOR BUSINESSES PERMITTED TO REOPEN IN MONO COUNTY**

On April 28, the Governor announced four stages of the “Resilience Roadmap” that is guiding the gradual reopening process throughout California and in Mono County. On May 20, California transitioned into Stage 2 to gradually reopen some **lower-risk workplaces with some adaptations.**

Every business in Mono County and in the Town of Mammoth Lakes is required to self-report on meeting all applicable County, State and Federal requirements using the [SELF-CERTIFICATION PORTAL](#). **Businesses that satisfy all the health and safety requirements, are required to prominently post the certificate at their place of business.** Additional [Mono County Business Guidance](#) and [Frequently Asked Questions](#) (FAQ) are also available online.

If your business sector has been permitted to open in Stage 2 but is not specifically identified in the [Self-Certification Portal](#), please click on the [Statewide Guidance](#) to implement mitigation measures and procedures to reduce the risk of COVID-19 to create a safer environment for workers and customers. When and if your business sector is listed in the Self-Certification Portal, please retroactively self-certify your business.

## **CALIFORNIA COUNTIES BEING MONITORED TO SLOW COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION**

On July 1, Governor Gavin Newsom and the California Department of Public Health released [guidance](#) directing counties that have been on the [County Monitoring List](#) for three consecutive days or more to close indoor operations for certain sectors which promote the mixing of populations beyond households and make adherence to physical distancing and wearing face coverings difficult. The guidance applies for a minimum of three weeks and is subject to an extension based on epidemiologic indicators. These sectors may modify operations to provide services outside or by pick-up. In addition, all brewpubs, breweries, bars, and pubs in these counties must close immediately, both indoor and outdoor.

Community spread of COVID-19 continues to be a concern across the state, and in particular for counties on the County Monitoring List. This puts vulnerable populations, including older Californians and those who have chronic conditions or compromised immune systems, at higher risk of becoming seriously ill due to the virus.

The state will work closely with local Health Departments to identify action steps and timelines for addressing issues that impact indicators of concern. The following counties are currently being monitored at this step with key action steps identified regarding the reopening of certain business sectors:

### NEW: PPE DISTRIBUTION FOR BUSINESSES

*July 13, 2020* - The Mammoth Lakes Chamber of Commerce (MLCC) was able to secure some additional supplies and will be distributing various personal protective equipment (PPE) on a first come first served basis **on Tuesday July 14 from 10:00am-12:00pm at the Visitor Center Parking lot**. The Chamber will have #coverupmono posters, surgical masks, and N95 masks. Hand sanitizer will also be available in smaller bottles, limited to four per business. They will also have 20 one-gallon jugs of disinfectant limited to one gallon per customer.

## STATE, COUNTY & TOWN DIRECTIVES, ORDERS AND SERVICES

### NEW: CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH ORDERS ALL COUNTIES TO CLOSE INDOOR OPERATIONS IN CERTAIN SECTORS

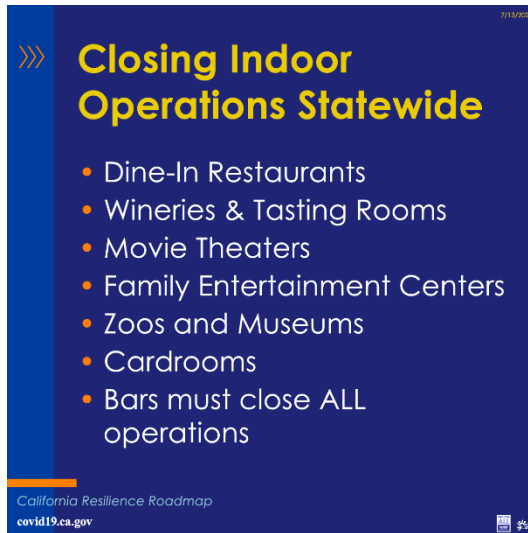
*July 13, 2020 - Mono County Unified Command will issue further guidance on these closures as soon as possible. This is a developing situation.*

Effective July 13, 2020, the California Department of Public Health has ordered ALL counties to close indoor operations in these sectors, including Mono County:

- Dine-in restaurants
- Wineries and tasting rooms
- Movie theaters
- Family entertainment centers (for example: bowling alleys, miniature golf, batting cages and arcades)

- Zoos and museums
- Cardrooms

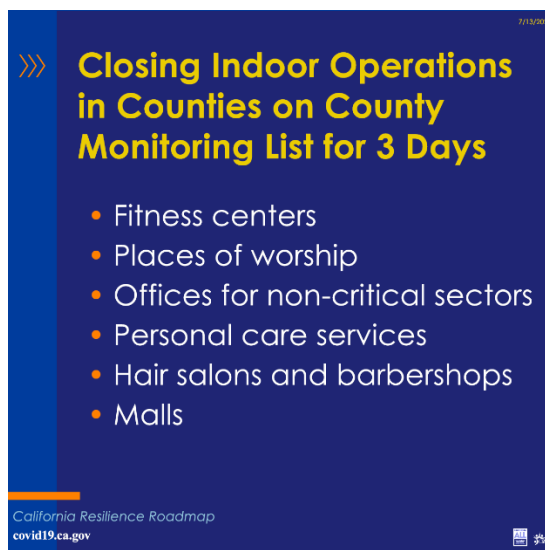
Additionally, bars, brewpubs, breweries, and pubs must close all operations both indoor and outdoor statewide.



Counties that have remained on the County Monitoring List for 3 consecutive days will be required to shut down the following industries or activities unless they can be modified to operate outside or by pick-up:

- Fitness centers
- Worship services
- Protests
- Offices for non-essential sectors
- Personal care services, like nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Malls

**This does NOT include Mono County at this time.**

## **RECREATION**

### **INYO NATIONAL CLOSES GROUP CAMPS UNDER FOREST ORDER**

*July 9, 2020* - On July 7, the Inyo National Forest extended the closure of all group campgrounds and two remote campgrounds under a [forest closure order](#). The closure can be terminated or extended depending in conditions. Please see Exhibit A (in the link above) for a full list of campgrounds included in this order.

The decision is based upon recommendations from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and state and local health authorities. Developed recreation group campsites on the Inyo National Forest typically draw large groups of people, creating mass gatherings and concentrated groups of forest visitors. This results in significant management oversight, especially during the high use conditions now being experienced.

Additionally, due to lack of personnel it is necessary to close two developed campgrounds, Grandview Campground and Kennedy Meadows Campground, located in remote areas of the Inyo National Forest. These facilities are located in areas that timely and routine cleaning cannot occur.

This closure is an interim measure. The Inyo National Forest will follow guidelines from the CDC, as well as state and local health departments, to ensure that the safety of our employees and our visitors is a priority.

Visitors are also urged to take the precautions recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) along with local health and safety guidance. April 30, 2020 – What you need to know about the Mono County Public Health Officer Order requiring face coverings while in public spaces and interacting with people outside of your household unit

## FACIAL COVERINGS ARE NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:

- A person is outdoors and unlikely to interact with people who are not members of their household unit, except at a distance of more than six feet. Though it is prudent and courteous to wear a face covering when passing others on trails, multi-use paths or sidewalks.
- A person is performing work in a room or location that is physically separated from other persons by walls or other impermeable barriers.
- When in the sole company of members of their own household unit.
- A person is the sole occupant of a vehicle or is sharing a vehicle only with members of his or her own household unit.

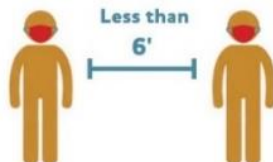

### FACE COVERING GUIDELINES

- Always wash your hands after touching your face covering or placing it on your face.
- Never touch the inside of your face covering.
- When not in use, store your face covering in a paper bag. Do not store on your forehead or around your neck.
- Wash homemade cloth face coverings with hot water and soap daily to kill infectious material.

### IN ADDITION, PLEASE NOTE:

- Persons working outdoors shall wear face coverings when within six feet of any other person, or in any situation where the individual could contaminate a surface or object with which other persons come in contact. In all other circumstances, persons working outdoors are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings.
- Retail and other businesses open to the public shall require customers or patrons to wear face coverings. All staff interacting with the public are required to wear face coverings.
- Employees at restaurants and other establishments providing for on-site food consumption (upon authorization to open) shall wear face coverings. Patrons at those establishments are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings while not eating or drinking.
